## Live & Learn Construction Grant

**Alsip-Merrionette Park Library awarded \$125,000 grant from State Librarian Jesse White**

We are very fortunate and grateful to have received a grant of \$125,000 that will greatly help toward the funding of our current building addition and remodeling project. These *Live and Learn Construction Grants* are awarded and administered by the Illinois Secretary of State and State Librarian to help public libraries pay for essential capital improvements. When this grant was awarded, Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White said, "This important grant program helps public libraries pay for the cost of projects such as remodeling for handicapped accessibility, new carpeting, interior or exterior painting, and in some cases new construction or additions to existing facilities. Many of our public libraries simply don't have sufficient funds to pay for these improvements on their own, though in some instances these grants do require local matching funds. Our public libraries are cornerstones of our communities, and they have never been more important. During these difficult economic times, statistics have shown that more and more citizens are using their local public library for things like free Internet access, CD's, DVD's, newspapers and magazines. I am pleased to be able to award these grants through the Illinois State Library to help maintain the infrastructure of our public libraries, and help them remain the best resource available to citizens for information."

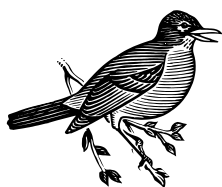

## Preschool Programs

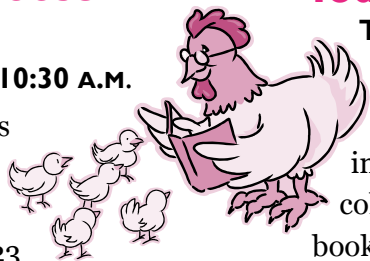
The library offers story times for preschool children at specific ages and stages of development that provide emergent literacy activities as well as social interaction. Registration is required.

## You've Got Construction Questions We've Got Answers!

We've been asked lots of questions about the library's renovation project since we moved to our temporary location on Cicero. Here are the answers to some of our most frequently asked questions.

### When will construction be finished?

Our estimated return date is early 2013.

### Will there be a second floor?

No. The two-story expansion refers to additional square footage in the basement as well as on the first floor.

### Why did you have to move during construction?

If you've traveled down Pulaski recently you may have noticed all the work that's been done at the library. The west wall and windows have been removed. Construction machinery has taken over the parking lot! Moving offsite has allowed the project to progress quickly and keep costs down.

### What's going on in the north parking lot?

Digging in the north parking lot is laying the groundwork for geothermal energy to be used to heat and cool the new building.

### Why did the library need a renovation?

In many ways we had outgrown our building. The renovation will give us an additional 14,000 square feet. This added space will provide room for more computers, more meeting rooms plus quiet study rooms. We'll also have more seating space, a Teen area, plus a drive-up book drop. People with laptops will find more places to sit and use our high speed Wi-Fi service. The building will also get an updated décor as well as a redesigned interior.
